

### **Membership**

Based on the latest National Membership Report for our post, our membership is at 258. According to this report, last year we lost 38 members (deceased); we gained 3 new members; and have 35 that are expiring. Our retention percentage is 86.3%. This means we need to get the 35 that are expiring up to date and we to need recruit an additional 10 new members.

For the past several years, we have been relatively successful in recruiting members. The only way to make this success permanent is to retain those members, recover past members and recruit new members. We must improve the way we communicate with our members at all levels of the organization. In many cases, we have lost touch with our members. We need to know who they are and what their needs are. Let us get back to the basics. Our priority is taking care of our members and the veteran community.

We need to put together a *dedicated* membership committee. Today's society communicates through social media. We do have a Facebook page and a Website, but we need to get aggressive in utilizing those media to advertise our post and to push membership. We require a savvy and aggressive person to drive our message through these media. As we begin this year of 2020, your Auxiliary is continuing to serve the Veterans and their families. We have made a donation to our National Auxiliary President Peggy Haake's "Special Project -Service Dogs for Veterans". We have also donated to our State President's "Special Project- VA Hospitals Mental Health Programs". Mary's father suffered from PTSD after serving in WWII.

Another program that we support is the VFW National Home for Children in Michigan. This program receives no government assistance in any form. Each month at WEST LA VA your Auxiliary goes and plays Bingo with the Veterans and does bedside visits to hospitalized Veterans. This part of the program was initiated by our own Post 2075. We also go to LBVA Hospital once a month and have "Coffee With The Vets" where we serve coffee and snacks. If you want to go to any of these activities, just let any Auxiliary member know and we will be glad to have you help.

As you can see, we do many things for Veteran. Come and support our activities because without YOU we could not do these activities!

Remember to also recruit new members. As an Auxiliary we need only about 20 more new members 'both female and male' to be 100%. I want to congratulate Val Braun, Susan Bryant and Maddie Cunningham-Colston for each recruiting the most members.

## POST SURGEON MESSAGE

### VA Priority Groups Qualifications

The number of veterans who can be enrolled in the health care program is determined by the amount of money Congress gives VA each year. Since funds are limited, VA set up Priority Groups to make sure that certain groups of veterans are able to be enrolled before others.

Once you apply for enrollment, your eligibility will be verified. Based on your specific eligibility status, you will be assigned a Priority Group. The Priority Groups range from 1-8 with 1 being the highest priority. Based on eligibility and income, some veterans may have to pay copay for treatment, and some may not be eligible for enrollment.

You may be eligible for more than one Priority Group. In that case, VA will always place you in the highest Priority Group that you are eligible for.

Depending on your Priority Group, the VA may reimburse you for your travel costs from your home to a medical facility.

#### Priority Group 1

- Veterans with service-connected disabilities rated 50% or higher
- Veterans determined by VA to be unemployable due to service-connected conditions

#### Priority Group 2

- Veterans with service-connected disabilities rated 30% - 40%

#### Priority Group 3

- Veterans who are former Prisoners of War (POWs)
- Veterans awarded a Purple Heart
- Veterans whose were discharged for a disability
- Veterans with service-connected disabilities rated 10% - 20%
- Veterans awarded special eligibility classification under Title 38, U.S.C., § 1151, "benefits for individuals disabled by treatment or vocational rehabilitation"
- Veterans awarded the Medal Of Honor

#### Priority Group 4

- Veterans who are receiving aid and attendance or housebound benefits
- Veterans who have been determined by VA to be catastrophically disabled

#### Priority Group 5

- Nonservice-connected veterans and noncompensable service-connected Veterans rated 0% disabled by VA with annual income below the VA's and geographically (based on your resident zip code) adjusted income limits.
- Veterans receiving VA pension benefits
- Veterans eligible for Medicaid programs

#### Priority Group 6

- Veterans with service-connected disabilities rated 0%
- Veterans exposed to Ionizing radiation during atmospheric testing or during the occupation of Hiroshima and Nagasaki
- Project 112/SHAD participants
- Veterans who served in Vietnam between Jan. 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975
- Veterans of the Persian Gulf War who served between Aug. 2, 1990 and Nov. 11, 1998
- Veterans who served on active duty at Camp Lejeune for not fewer than 30 days beginning Aug. 1, 1953 and ending Dec. 31, 1987
- Combat veterans who were discharged on or after Jan. 28, 2003, are eligible for enhanced benefits for 5 years after discharge.

#### Priority Group 7

- Veterans with gross household income below certain limits and who agree to pay copays

#### Priority Group 8

- Veterans with gross household income above certain limits and who agree to pay copays

#### VA Travel Reimbursement

Reimbursement for mileage or public transportation may be paid to the following:

1. Veterans with service-connected disabilities rated at 30% or more;
2. Veterans traveling for treatment of a service-connected condition;
3. Veterans receiving a VA pension;
4. Veterans traveling for scheduled compensation or pension examinations;
5. Veterans whose income does not exceed the maximum VA pension rate;

Mileage reimbursement is made at the current rate of 41.5 cents per mile. The deductibles are \$3 for a one-way trip, \$6 for a round trip, with a maximum of \$18 per calendar month. However, these deductibles can be waived if they cause a financial hardship to the veteran.

The deductible is also waived for veterans traveling for scheduled compensation or pension examinations.

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


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
